The library does not endorse opinions contained in its materials. Patrons are free to enjoy, dislike, or ignore any item in the collection. However, no one is free to restrict another's use of library materials.

A request to remove library materials creates complex legal and ethical questions for both the library and the community. To initiate a request, a Statement of Concern form should be filled out completely and given to the Library Director. The Director will review the challenged material and prepare a written response. Patrons who do not accept the Director's decision may appeal to the Library Board of Trustees.
