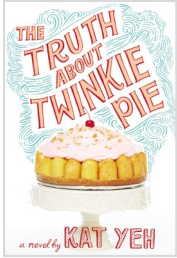
## *Pi in the Sky* by Wendy Mass

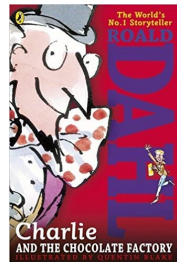

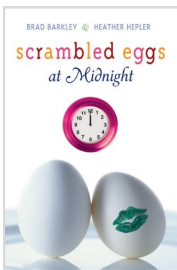

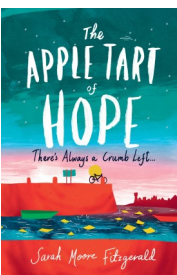
