Bookmarking The Past: VPPL History

The Villa Park Public Library will celebrate its 100th anniversary in two years (2028). The Villa Park Woman's Club began discussing the need for a local library in 1927. The first library opened in a real estate office on Ardmore Ave. in August 1928. As staff work on updating the library's history in anticipation of its anniversary, we thought it would be an ideal time to acknowledge those individuals who have made an impact on the library along the way.





Barbara Sindelar was the editor of the first library newsletter in 1984. She was in the

area visiting family this past August, so we jumped on the opportunity to take her photo along with the first newsletter, shown in the top photo. The bottom photo shows Barbara with her daughter, Meredith Meder, who presents the Cheese Tasting Classes at the library.

Building and Site Improvements

The Library Board has contracted with Sheehan Nagle Hartray, a Woolpert Company, to assist in improving building and site features. The front outdoor plaza will have an improved dropoff area, and expanded green space. In addition, the Circulation and Youth Desks will be reconfigured to allow more space for families in the Youth area. A door from the Youth Department to outdoor space will be located directly in the Youth preschool area. On the second floor, an additional study room will be added.

Storytime

For young children, engaging in play is a crucial way to learn about the world and how things work, as well as about themselves. Play looks like it's just for fun, but it's a lot more than that—it's all about exploration of the five senses! Play also gives children a chance to interact and learn how to be social with other children.

STORIES ARE NOT JUST BOOKS!

ages 3-5 to attend independently. Registration is for the entire season.

Talking with a child plays a huge role in their development—not just speech and first words from babies! Speaking with children can begin at birth. Talk your way through the day. Introduce baby to a wide world of sounds, rhymes, and rhythms. Tell them tales from memory and make up stories, too—stories are not just found in books. Some stories are told with pictures instead of words, and gestures instead of sounds, like a mime or a game of charades might do.

PARENTS = TEACHERS

Caregivers are the first and best teachers, and most important influence, in a child's life. Active engagement with an attentive caregiver greatly increases the chances for a child to succeed in school and in life. This caregiver can be a parent, a grandparent, or other family member or adult who is closely involved in the daily activities of life for a young child. The first three years of a child's life are the most intense brain-building time of their lives.
